

[INSTRUCTIONS TO AUTHORS]

(Revised on November 25, 2008)

GENERAL. The *Japanese Journal of Medical Mycology* is published by and is the official organ of the Japanese Society for Medical Mycology. The journal publishes original papers, reviews, and brief reports on topics related to medical and veterinary mycology.

The copyright of any paper published in this journal is the property of the Japanese Society for Medical Mycology. The full text of any paper published in the Japanese Journal of Medical Mycology is published in J-STAGE (<http://jstage.jst.go.jp/browse/jjmm/-char/ja/>). Additionally, it is linked to the MEDLINE database (<http://www.nlm.nih.gov/>).

The journal welcomes submissions from everyone, irrespective of membership in the Society. Submitted manuscripts must represent reports that have been neither previously published nor accepted for publication in another journal.

MANUSCRIPTS. All manuscripts should be submitted through the submission site of this Society (<http://www.jsmm.org/>). Uploaded files should be confined to PDF (.pdf) format for text and either PDF (.pdf) or JPG (.jpg) for figures. When files produced using MS Word (.doc) cannot be converted into PDF (.pdf), please note the following:

The text plus general information (/review) should be, in principle, six (6) pages (about 24,000 characters, including spaces) or fewer in its printed version. Short Notes should be three (3) pages or fewer in the printed version. However, regarding figures and tables, one printed page is expected to be equivalent to 4,000 characters.

Manuscripts submitted for publication are expected type-written and double-spaced. Authors whose native language is not English must have their manuscript checked by a professional translator, preferably a native English speaker. The text of each manuscript should be divided into the following sections: Abstract, Introduction, Materials/Patients/Subjects and Methods, Results, Discussion, Acknowledgements, and References. All pages must be numbered consecutively in the following order, with each of the following beginning on a separate page: Abstract, text, Acknowledgements, References, Tables, and Figure Legends. All abbreviations must be defined the first time they are used.

ABSTRACT. The abstract for an Original Paper should be of 250 words or fewer; that for a Short Note should be of 100 words or fewer.

These should clearly indicate the scope and main conclusions of the paper.

REFERENCES. All references must be cited in numerical order as they appear in the text. Unpublished observations and personal communications may be included in the text

only.

Each reference should include the following:

- a. Papers published in periodicals: author (s) (surname followed by initials), full title of paper, journal abbreviation, volume (in Arabic numerals), first and last page numbers, and year of publication, e.g.: Brummer E, Hanson LH, Restrepo A, Stevens DA: *In vivo* and *in vitro* activation of pulmonary macrophages by gamma-IFN for enhanced killing of *Paracoccidioides brasiliensis* or *Blastomyces dermatitidis*. *J Immunol* **140**: 2786-2789, 1988. Journal titles should be abbreviated according to the system adopted in Chemical Abstract.
- b. Books: author (s), full title of chapter, editor (s), title of book, edition (if other than first), volume, first and last page numbers, publisher, name of the city of publisher, and year of publication, e.g.: Fleischman J and Lehrer RI: Phagocytic mechanisms in host responses. *In* *The Fungi Pathogenic for Humans and Animals* (Howard, H ed), vol. 3, part C, pp.123-149, Marcel Dekker, New York, 1985.

ILLUSTRATIONS. Illustrations (including figures, photographs and tables) must not be included in the text file. Illustrations should be cropped as closely as possible to the area of interest of the text and should be either 8 or 16.5 cm wide (half or full page width), not exceeding 23 cm in height. Masking instructions, lettering or arrows should be indicated directly on the photograph. If the author wishes to have a group of figures printed together in a single block (composite figure), the separate figure panels should be of mounted width and height, be sized to fit the widths and heights described above, and be numbered as panels of one figure. Designation of each figure panel making up the composite figure should be marked on the transparent overlay in the lower left corner of each panel in alphabetical order (a, b, c,...).

Magnification of and stain for light micrographs must be described in the legend and a scale bar should be presented in the lower right corner of electron micrographs, with an indication of the size of the scale bar in the legend. Color photographs may be submitted, but the author will be asked to pay the cost of reproduction.

FIGURE LEGENDS. Legends should be numbered with Arabic numerals and should be sufficiently clear so that the figure is understandable without reference to the text.

CHARGES. No charge for four pages or fewer will be assessed, irrespective of the manuscript type, when the leading author is a regular member and all coauthors are members (including temporary members). (When the text pages exceed the limits described above, the charge per page shall be 5,000 yen, which must be paid by the author.) When the manuscript is commissioned by this Society, the charge for four pages or fewer shall be free,

irrespective of membership in the Society. Aside from those charges described above, the charge per page shall be 5,000 yen and whole pages shall be paid by the author. Thirty (30) offprints will be supplied free of charge to the corresponding author. Additional offprints may be ordered on the form accompanying the page proofs. The cost of printing color photographs must be borne by the author.
